The Bush Fire Advisory Committee is requested to review Notice and advise administration of any changes that need to be made.

(Att 3.1) The Shire of Boyup Brook 2022/2023 Fire Information & Firebreak Notice was sent out with the agenda. The Bush Fire Advisory Committee was requested to review and advise administration of any changes that need to be made.

The Ranger highlighted the booklet contained additional information related to other provisions of the *Bush Fire Act* and Regulations, general hazard and preparedness information. BFAC is only requested to review the Firebreak Notice - enforceable activities under section 33 *Bush Fires Act 1954* only.

Information on other sections in the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, and other information or guidance that is not enforceable through section 33 were separated from the firebreak notice, and hard copies of the following were available at the meeting.

Michael Giles asked why the Ranger is reviewing the Notice and Fire information booklet? It was advised; WALGA and DFES have collaborated to produce a Guidance Note to support Local Governments to produce an effective and enforceable firebreak notice. Hard copies of the draft Guidance Note were also made available at the meeting.

The Chief advised there are local rules that have been decided by BFAC added to the booklet to be enforced. The Ranger advised information on other sections in the Bush Fires Act, and other information or guidance that is not enforceable through section 33 should be clearly separated from the fire-break notice and make reference to the section of Act that it is enforceable under, it can be in the same document but under a clearly separate heading. The Shire may need to investigate reviewing our Bush Fires Local Law.

All lots identified by the X-Ray team to DBCA have been burnt, Tristan Mead thank DBCA for their work.

10 GENERAL BUSINESS

10.1 Memorandum of Understanding - Fire Truck Use at Boyup Brook

The MOU between PF Olsen and The Shire of Boyup Brook – Fire Brigades of Chowerup and adjacent localities. Intends to locate a truck with equipment for the purposes of firefighting for the use of the Brigade.

The MOU was sent out with the agenda and tabled. Questions were asked including who will be responsible for consumables, where will it be housed?

Michael Giles stated if the Shire had signed the previously prepared Plantation Industry MOU there would be no need for individual MOUs as responsibilities for consumables etc. are all covered.

In June 22 the CEO at the time Dale Putland asked the plantation industry to provide support and liability, however all this was also covered in the Plantation Industry MOU. The Plantation Industry MOU was presented to Council, for the 3rd time 23 February 2019 with no response and the question was asked if the MOU was ever presented to BFAC?

The Shire President Richard Walker responded that the Plantation Industry MOU manages risks collectively and shares resources. Boyup Brook Shire Council assesses individual plantation risks with the relevant plantation companies, through the development planning process.

It was agreed the Shire president Richard Walker and the X-Ray team will review the MOU with PF Olsen before September 2023.

Action Item

10.2 Servicing of fire units and trailers

Charles Caldwell asked that the brigades take back servicing of fire units, last year some of the units were left at the Shire Depot for extended periods of time. Tristan Meads stated Brigades are unable to service the units under the ESL and the insurance may be affected.

GENERAL COMMUNICATION BETWEEN X-RAY TEAM AND DECISIONS

10.3 Contacted for Brigade business

Scotts Brook seek clarification on the Rangers position and which Ranger should be contacted for Brigade business. It was clarified the Rangers will share responsibility for Brigade business.

Rangers are working on the best way to receive the various Brigade requests and utilising/improving the Shire's existing Customer Service request system where first responsible officers will be allocated.

10.4 Information is not going through the X-Ray

West Boyup questioned the location of the new fire shed and asked why information is not going through the X-Ray team and is now public information through Council

meetings.

Questions were raised at the West Boyup Brook AGM and asked at the Council meeting. The questions were taken on notice and Ranger Donna Forsyth responded that a new fire shed was a suggestion only without plan or approval. Water connection for a washing machine in the existing shed is approved and the work has been contracted to Russel Squires. It is the shires preference that business arising from Brigade meetings are recorded in the minutes and raised through BFAC.

10.5 BFAC agenda delay

Brad Skraha raised concerns that the BFAC agenda was delayed, and not enough time was given to review the information like the MOU and Firebreak Notice.

The Ranger apologised that the agenda was delayed, due to IT issues. Tristan Mead noted the date was not confirm for the BFAC meeting however BFAC generally meets third week of May each year. Delays also incurred from receiving the Brigade agendas and the Firebreak Notice is review annually.

Division 3 - Annual general meetings of bush fire brigades

3.6 Holding of annual general meeting

A bush fire brigade is to hold its annual general meeting during the month of March or April each year.(amended 12 August 2005).

3.7 Nomination of bush fire control officers to Bush Fire Advisory Committee

At the annual general meeting of a bush fire brigade, one brigade member is to be nominated to the Bush Fire Advisory Committee to serve as the bush fire control officer for the brigade area until the next general meeting.

3.8 Nomination of bush fire control officer to the local government

If the local government has not established a Bush Fire Advisory Committee, then at the annual general meeting of a bush fire brigade, the bush fire brigade is to nominate one brigade member to the local government to serve as the bush fire control officer for the brigade area until the next annual general meeting.

3.9 Minutes to be tabled before the Bush Fire Advisory Committee

- (1) The Secretary is to forward a copy of the minutes of the annual general meeting of a bush fire brigade to the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer within one month after the meeting.
- (2) The Chief Bush Fire Control Officer is to table the minutes of a bush fire brigade's annual general meeting at the next meeting of the –
 - (a) Bush Fire Advisory Committee; or
 - (b) Council, if there is no Bush Fire Advisory Committee, following their receipt under subclause (1).

10.6 MAF treatment applications

It was also raised through Trian Mead that MAF treatment applications areas were being identified outside of the X-Ray team consultation. The team were advised consultation and identification of MAF treatment areas are not limited to the X-Ray team.

Below is from DFES Bush Fire Mitigation Coordinator MAF GP 2020 – 2023 R1 Status for the Shire of Boyup Brook (**Attachment 7**).

"There has been consultation with the X ray team, Local and State government stake holders to develop the treatment applications for submission.

Identification of assets that have been risk assessed in accordance with the Bush Fire Risk Management Plan and Mitigation Activity Fund Grants Program have also been included as required by the Bushfire Risk Management Branch to meet funding requirements and treatment Objectives".

10.7 Contact details of absentee landowners

David Turner of Tonebridge Brigade raised, there is an issue of obtaining contact details for absentee landowners is case of fire emergency and of fire mitigation work. FCO's need this information. How do we obtain this information? In case of an emergency, having to contact ranger is not practical and fast enough.

Dave Turner requested BFAC request Council to make attempts to provide Brigade with all land owners contact details.

The committee was advised giving out contact phone number is against Local Government privacy laws however names and postal address can be given. The committee was asked in what situation have the issue arises as each request will have a different priority level. The provided example was; giving notify to adjoining

landowner regarding mitigation work once a permit was issued. The Ranger reminded the requirement of a permit holder to ensure they have given notice to owners or occupiers of adjoining land prior to obtaining a permit. Period of notice to neighbours prior to burning cannot be more than 28 days or less than 4 days (this can be done by post), although lesser notice may be determined by mutual agreement. It is a good method to have contact phone number of owners or occupiers of adjoining land to determine mutual agreement.

Another example was given that DBCA was carrying out a burn and the FCO wanted to warn the adjoining landowner and check their firebreaks were in place. It was acknowledged this local information sharing is supported and encouraged.

McAlinden Fire Brigade shared that they updated their McAlinden Location Fire Brigade Contact List in May 2023 and encourage other brigades to create or update local contact list. This list includes a reference number, contact names, phone numbers and lot numbers. The reference numbers are recorded on their McAlinden Brigade map.

Tristan Mead said the WhatsApp group was an effective form of communication and encourage brigade to create local communication tree for their areas before emergency situations arise.

The Shire Ranger advised that landowners and occupiers are very grateful to Brigades and are generally willing to provide their phone numbers when requested. A suggestion was made to write to landowner and request emergency contact details. The mail out could be sent with rates.

It was agreed a letter from the Brigades requesting emergency contact details to be sent with rates.

Action Item

10.8 Waters and Rivers

Glen Mead raises there are still ongoing mitigation works required in waters and rivers however DWAR have no money. The question was asked if DBCA could assist? DBCA advised they can't take on other department land tenure and they also have a limited budget.

10.9 Crown land

It was asked with the UCL managed land going back to traditional landowners will DBCA now administer fire mitigation works on UCL land?

It was noted that the Shire has not received an official notice that traditional landowners will be acquiring UCL. DBCA stated that some UCL land has vested management orders in place by various agencies. DBCA already has UCL lots vested in their control as would the Shire of Boyup Brook.

DBCA also noted that they are not obligated to give notice of burning in the same manner as permit burns.

10.10 Slip on unit insurance

Rob Introvigne, of Nollajup Brigade has heard the green/yellow slip-on fire units that require straps to hold them down are banned and seek clarification if this is correct? The Shire Ranger question how brigades are checking info fire, are they using T-Cards? Also, do the units have the ID Stickers.

The Shire will seek further clarification from LGIS.

Action Item

10.11 Plantation inspections, penalties and enforcement

Ron Bingham, of Gibbs Road asked if the fine could be increased non-compliant plantation inspection that re-offend and don't complete firebreak? The Ranger advised the \$250 penalty for non-compliance under *Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954* is legislated therefore cannot be increased. The Shire can elect to have the matter heard in court and seek the maximum penalty however prosecutions incurs additional costs that may not be recovered.

The council plantation development planning approval process was discussed. It is possible for Local Governments to impose a condition on a development approval to require ongoing compliance with a BMP which is enforceable under the *Planning and Development Act 2005.*

The Shire can engage contractors to carry out the requirements of a fire- break notice that has not been met by the landowner or occupier and the expense is fully recoverable in the same manner as rates.

The X-Ray team were encouraged to report non-compliance of the Firebreak Notice to the Ranger for enforcement and document any previous warnings they give to gain compliance.
