Parameters

Still ensuring , community cropping, research trials, scholarship funding and infrastructure retention

53 ha peppercorn lease for community cropping, which would include

! 10 ha trials

!! gravel usage

Advantage to Shire

Reduced compliance, RPMC at arms length to Shire

House available to the BB Shire with 12 mth notice should it be required

Rates payable by RPMC Committee

Research and trials will be organized by RPMC

Maintenance of infrastructure the reasonability of RPMC

Should this management proposal fail all assets to be returned to the Shire

A farm safety programme will be undertaken with Farm Safe WA

Advantage to RPMC

All assets to come under the control of RPMC except for house with those considerations

Enable discussions with AWI, with the prospect of shearing schools resuming

Considered the best training facility in WA

All stock, plant, fodder and grain on inspection, to be under the RPMC (numbers and schedule, as provided by CEO)

Shire responsible for infrastructure insurance

RPMC working reserve to be increased to \$400,000 to enable the farm to operate

Closer communication and involvement with the community, The RPMC will have 6 members and a Shire rep, ratified at AGM

Part time manager, with contract cropping

Budget prepared for Jan 2027-Dec28 on these proposals

Early access of property to feed sheep, purchase of rams , sale of surplus sheep and pasture topping for 2027 cropping programme
