

# **Project Update**

As we move through March and approach April, the year has already proven to be a productive and eventful one for our ongoing projects. Here's an update on key initiatives:



### Talison Lithium Funded All-Ages Playground

The much-anticipated all-ages playground, funded by Talison Lithium, is beginning to take shape, and we are excited to report significant progress. Footpaths are now being laid, marking a pivotal step towards completion. Additionally, our Boulder Apostles have arrived on-site all the way from Victoria, adding a unique and artistic touch to the project. The team is working diligently, and we look forward to seeing this community space come to life in the coming months. Please remember, entry to the construction site is strictly not permitted.



#### **LRCI Funded Footpath Project**

The footpath project funded by the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) program is currently 60% complete. While progress has been steady, labour shortages have led to some delays. However, we are optimistic the project will be finished by the end of April. Once completed, this project will enhance accessibility and improve connectivity for the local community. Graffiti. #### Flax Mill Water Tank Installation

In another positive development, we are pleased to announce the Shire has been successful in a grant from the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) to install three new 250,000-litre water tanks at the Flax Mill. These tanks will capture additional water from the large sheds, which will be used for reticulating the Flaxmill Caravan Park, as well as being available for firefighting purposes. This initiative supports both sustainability and safety in the region.



#### Roads

The Regional Road Group Project on Cranbrook Road is now 90% complete. The estimated completion date for this project is late March/early April 2025. The Regional Road Group Project on Arthur River Road has just commenced and is already 8% complete. The estimated completion date for this project is late May 2025. As always please be aware of roadwork signage, obey the road rules and drive to the conditions.

# Off-leash dogs: preventing trouble

Walking your dog is meant to be a nice casual and calming experience, however sometimes things can go wrong that are out of our hands.

What do you do when you are enjoying your on lead walk with your pooch and an off-lead dog runs towards you? Many people are unsure what to do in these situations and sometimes our actions can make it worse.

### Why put a lead on your dog?

It is the law, unless you're in a designated off-lead area. Even if you have the friendliest dog in the world, not everyone does. A friendly dog running at a nervous or fearful dog will cause long-term side effects for the unsuspecting dog.

#### Local councils can charge owners for walking their dogs off-lead.

If you are aware of regular dog owners who disregard the rules, or refuse to leash their dog when asked, please report it to the Shire. Penalties under the *Dog Act 1976* range from \$200 to \$5000. Walking your dog off-lead is like saying, "I don't need to wear a seatbelt because I am a perfect driver". You cannot control what the other cars do, and similarly, you cannot control what other dogs do.

Now that the scorching heat has subsided, autumn will bring its own set of weather considerations. Get prepared for potential storms and rainfall! Now is the perfect time to inspect and secure any loose items that may have come loose on your roof over summer, clean gutters ready for rain and make sure you stay informed regarding weather forecasts.

With school holidays in full swing, many residents and visitors will be taking to the roads. Remember these essential safety tips whilst hitting the road. Plan your trip and allow plenty of time for rest stops, have your vehicle checked or serviced before you leave and take those breaks that you planned for on your journey. Fatigue can have life long consequences!

While autumn offers a welcome respite, it's never too early to start planning for the next bushfire season. Consider this a perfect time for reviewing your Bushfire Survival Plan, tackling property maintenance, fuel reduction or upgrading those firebreaks, start that fire-resistant garden you've always thought about and investigate water tank or sprinkler system options to make your home and assets more defensible for the next bushfire season.





Please remember that the restricted burning period remains in effect until April 30th. Permits are still required for campfires and other burning activities. Always practice safe campfire management and ensure you have adequate water on hand.

# Important information about rates





If you are a pensioner or senior who would like to claim the Government's Rate Rebate Scheme, you must pay the required portion of your rates by 30 June 2025. If the required portion is not paid by the 30 June of each year, the rebate for that year will not apply. This year the rebate is capped at \$750 for pensioners and \$100 for seniors and is only applicable to rates and the Emergency Services Levy (ESL). ESL rebates are 50% for pensioners and 25% for seniors meaning all other charges like rubbish and waste are not part of the rebate scheme and must be paid in full.



If your rates are deferred, they remain as a debt on the property until paid; are not required to be paid until the entitlement to defer ceases (that is, the applicant moves out, sells the property, or passes away with no surviving spouse/de facto); may be paid at any time however a rebate cannot be claimed, and do not incur interest charges.
