# **CAT OWNERSHIP**













#### Registration

- All cat owners are reminded that cats, six months of age and over must be registered.
- All cats must be registered by a person 18 years or older.
- Registration forms are required to be completed and taken to the Shire of Boyup Brook Administration, accompanied with your cats

sterilisation and microchip certificate, and your driver's license and concession card if applicable.

 Whenever your cat is not confined at its property it needs to be wearing its registration tag as this will help the Ranger identify it as a pet and not a stray.



Cat registrations expire on 31 October every year.

## **Hiring of Cat Traps**



- Traps can be hired on a weekly basis by coming into the Shire of Boyup Brook Administration Office.
- Traps can be hired by residents of the Shire of Boyup Brook.
- Traps are free to hire however if not returned replacement fees apply.

### **Microchipping and Sterilisation**

- Under the Cat Act 2011, you are required to microchip and sterilise your cat at six months of age.
- Microchipping your cat is a permanent way to identify your cat and assists the ranger in finding its home.
- Your local veterinarian can microchip and sterilise your cat and will give you a copy of their sterilisation and microchip certificate.



### **Responsible Cat Ownership Checklist**

Microchip your cat.
Sterilise your cat.
Register your cat with your Local Government.
Ensure your cat is easily identifiable by wearing a collar with its name tag and current registration tag.
Vaccinate your cat.
Keep your cat confined to your property at all times.
Ensure your cats details are kept up to date with your Local
Government and Microchip Registry.
Ensure your cat has a warm sleeping area with food, water and a litter tray.

#### **Breeders**

- Anyone wanting to become a breeder are required under the Cat Act 2011 to obtain approval from their Local Government.
- An application form will need to be submitted at the Shire of Boyup Brook Administration.
  Once it has been approved a breeding license will be granted for one year.
