Identification

Many lost dogs or dogs wandering at large that are apprehended by the Ranger are unable to be returned to their owners because they have no identification tags.

Your dog must have a current registration tag and must also have identification giving your name and address.

If your dog is injured and taken to a veterinarian, the vet can contact you immediately if your carries your telephone number.

Change of Details

- You are required to inform your Local Government immediately of any change of ownership, change of address or if the dog has died.
- If you have moved Local Governments, you are required to register the dog at the new Local Government.

Lost your dog?

What to do when you lose your dog

Don't just wait for it to come back. It may be in the pound, it may be injured, or it may be in someone's yard.

Check around your neighbourhood. Go to places that the dog regularly visits, such as the park. Check local shopping centres and schools.

Contact the Shire of Boyup Brook Ranger as soon as possible to see if the dog has been impounded on (08) 9765 1200.

Advertise in on social media, put up notices on shopping centre notice boards or put slips of paper in letterboxes. Give a description of the dog and your name, address and telephone number. You could offer a reward.

All dogs must be registered with your Local Government from three months of age.

Sunrise is a good time to look for your dog as this is when it is more likely to be on the move.

Dogs may wander a long way. If you have moved recently, your dog might try to return to your old house.

Keep looking for several weeks. Sometimes people find a dog and do not report it to the Shire straight away as they are worried that the dog might be destroyed.

The Shire is required to keep a dog for at least 72 hours before disposing of it.

If your dog is in the pound, you must attend the Shire of Boyup Brook Administration Office first to pay a fee, plus any fines for offences your dog may have committed while wandering before collecting it from the pound.

Found a stray dog?

What to do if you find a stray dog

Notify the Shire of Boyup Brook Ranger on (08) 9765 1200

If the owner of the dog is looking for it, it is likely they will call the Ranger. If you keep the dog and do not report it to the Ranger, the dog's owners may not be able to find it.

Some Shires may allow you to keep the dog if it is unclaimed after a certain period of time. Some Shires may require the dog to be sterilised before it goes to a new owner.

Check with people in your community to see if they have lost a dog.

The dog's owner may have contacted the vet. They may be able to help you find the owner.

Advertise on social media or put up notices around town.

If the dog is a pedigree, contact the breed club. Lists of breed clubs are available through the Canine Association of WA.
