EMERGENCY BRIDGE WORKS

JAYES BRIDGE IS CLOSED TO ALL HEAVY TRAFFIC NO VEHICLES GREATER THAN 2 TONNE GROSS WEIGHT

On advice of Main Roads, a temporary load limit restriction of 2 tonnes has been placed on Jayes Bridge, Jayes Road for emergency bridge works. Any vehicles exceeding 2 tonnes must use alternative routes.

Please note that surveillance cameras are in use.

RANGER NEWS - BURNING SEASON

Prohibited Burning Season is due to end on 15 March 2023, when we enter the Restricted Burning Season which will last until 30 April 2023, unless otherwise notified. Restricted Burning Season requires a permit to burn which can be authorised by your area Fire Control Officer. You must have your permit no less than four (4) days before you intend to burn and you must clearly understand your obligations and responsibilities under section 18 of the *Bush Fires Act (1954)* and regulation 15B of the *Bush Fire Regulations (1954)*. One often forgotten obligation and responsibility under the Act and regulations is to "give notice of your intention to burn to the owner and occupier of any adjoining land." When applying for your permit, discuss with your Fire Control Officer what will be required for your planned burn, eg if it's a bush patch you might need to remove some large items or prepare a fire break; if it's garden clippings you might need your FCO to come over to see that what you are burning is ready and safe. Burning green materials causes smoke which may cause illness to you and your neighbours. Some garden waste is better off at the Transfer Station. Plan ahead and you should have no problems with your burn!
