



### PLANNED BURNING WITH RANGER DONNA

In the south of the state, planned burning on private land is best planned and conducted from April to October. When completed properly, planned burning is an efficient way to remove the build-up of fuel over larger areas of land where other methods are too labour intensive. A planned burn not only helps to safeguard lives and property in the event of a bushfire, but generally results in less environmental disturbance than other methods, benefiting many native plants and animals.

As a landholder or occupier of land it is your responsibility to manage fuel loads in accordance with the Bush Fires Act 1954 and requirements of your local government. Always check local restrictions, pre-organise support and assistance with your local brigade, create or clear firebreaks, test water sources and ensure your hoses and equipment reach the area, and plan to have the burn supervised until it is fully extinguished. Failure to meet these minimum requirements may end up with a penalty and a hole in your hip-pocket!
