

Keeping Our Community Safe: A Reminder for Dog Owners

Over the past few months, Ranger Services has noticed an increase in wandering dogs and dog attacks in our community.

We ask all dog owners to:

- Ensure your dog is securely contained within your yard and kept on a leash when out walking.
- Make sure your dog is registered with the Shire, fines apply for unregistered dogs over the age of three months.
- Keep only the prescribed number of dogs permitted on your property.

If your dog is found wandering and picked up by the Ranger, it will be impounded, and fees will apply.

If your dog is involved in a dog attack, whether against a person, livestock, or another animal, and the incident is reported, the Ranger will visit you. Depending on the seriousness of the attack, your dog may be seized or declared dangerous, and you may receive multiple fines.

Shire of Boyup Brook Annual Awards 2026 Final days to nominate



The Committee comprises of Councillors and voluntary Community members and is Chaired by the Shire President.

Background Information

Rylington Park Institute for Agricultural Training and Research (Rylington Park) is located in Mayanup, 27km from Boyup Brook town site on the Boyup Brook – Cranbrook Road. The 650-hectare property was gifted to the Shire of Boyup Brook in 1985 by the late Mr Eric Farleigh for Research and Training in Agriculture and the betterment of Boyup Brook.

The property is managed by the Shire of Boyup who employ staff to operate the farm, hosts shearing schools, workshops and coordinate fertiliser and seed trials on the property. The Australian Wool Innovation (AWI) provide financial support for Rylington Park to hosts shearing and wool classing schools annually. These training schools attract youth interested in shearing or sheep handling professions, which is important for the sustainability of the Sheep industry.

Understanding Burning Seasons in Boyup Brook: A Community Guide

As residents of Boyup Brook, we all share a responsibility to protect our homes and environment from fire. Understanding the Shire's Restricted and Prohibited Burning Seasons helps everyone stay safe and compliant.



Why We Have Burning Seasons

Boyup Brook, like much of WA, faces high bushfire risk during certain times of the year. Burning seasons are introduced to manage this risk, based on weather, fuel loads (dry vegetation), and fire danger ratings.



Restricted Burning Season - Use Extreme Caution

The Restricted Burning Season usually runs from October 9 to November 30 and March 1 to April 30, but dates may change. Always check with the Shire.

You must not:



- Burn without a permit.
- Leave a fire unattended.
- Conduct large-scale burns without approval.
- Burn on high fire danger days or during a ban.

You may:



- Burn small garden refuse or have a campfire only if:
 - o It's lit between 6 pm-11 pm and fully out by midnight.
 - There's a 5-metre clear area around the fire.
 - A responsible adult remains with water or equipment to extinguish it.
 - Never burn on days rated High or above, or during a Total Fire Ban.

You can also use:



- Approved incinerators (with spark arresters) and
- Gas or electric BBQs, unless a Total Fire Ban is in place.

Your Role in Fire Safety

- Stay informed: Check the Shire's website, Facebook page, or local noticeboards for updates.
- Prepare your property: Clear gutters, mow lawns, remove dry vegetation, and maintain firebreaks.
- Have a bushfire plan: Know what you'll do and where you'll go if a fire threatens.
- Report fires immediately by calling 000.
- Be responsible: When in doubt, don't light up.

By following these guidelines and respecting the burning season rules, we can all help keep Boyup Brook safe. For more information or permits, contact the Shire of Boyup Brook or your local Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade.
