Shire Council's Message

Council is pleased to present the Shire of Boyup Brook's adopted Annual Budget for the 2026/2027 financial year. This budget reflects careful financial planning, responsible decision making and Council's continued commitment to investing in the future of our community. While rising costs continue to affect households, businesses and the Shire, a 9% rate yield increase has been adopted to help support the delivery of essential services, community and major infrastructure projects while maintaining the Shire's long term financial sustainability.

Construction of the new Evacuation Centre and Sporting Clubrooms continues to progress well, representing a significant investment in our community's future. The new facility will provide an important sporting hub and emergency evacuation centre for Boyup Brook and surrounding communities. Council acknowledges the valuable support received from government, sporting associations and community groups in helping to bring this important project to life. Major works are also planned for the Swimming Pool, including pool bowl painting/sealing and joint repairs, helping to ensure this much-loved facility continues to be enjoyed by our community for years to come.

Council continues to invest in community assets that support essential services, improve accessibility and preserve our local history. The refurbishment of the Boyup Brook Medical Centre has improved access to the facility through a relocated main entrance and automatic door, while enhanced medical software has been implemented to support the delivery of healthcare services. Major electrical works at the Boyup Brook Museum have also helped protect this valued community asset and preserve our history for future generations. We encourage you to visit the Museum and see the improvements, the team would love to see you.

Council values open communication and encourages community members to ask questions, share ideas and stay informed. Community members can connect with Council by attending Our Community Matters informal sessions, Council meetings and Public Question Time, or by making an appointment with the Shire President, Councillors or Chief Executive Officer. We look forward to continuing to work together with our community, partners and local organisations to build a liveable, connected and thriving Boyup Brook for everyone.

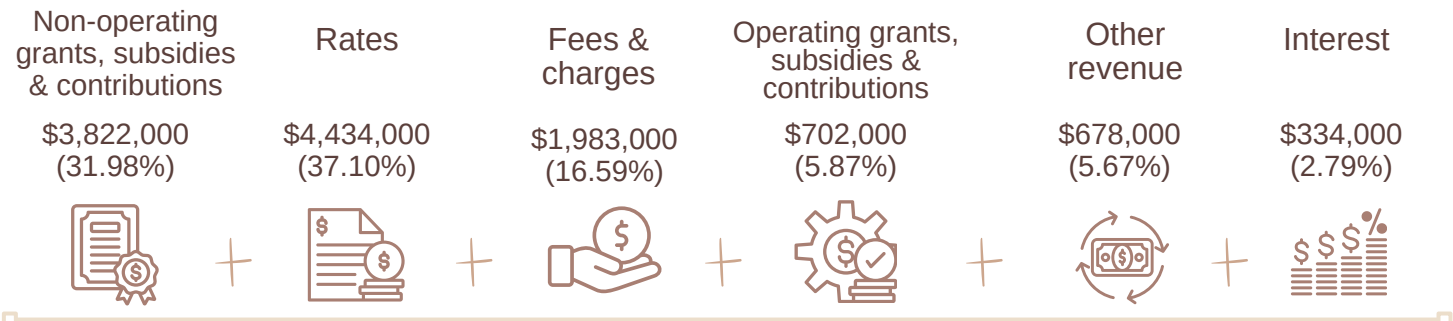

A combination of rates, grants, fees and other income helps Council provide the services our community relies on.



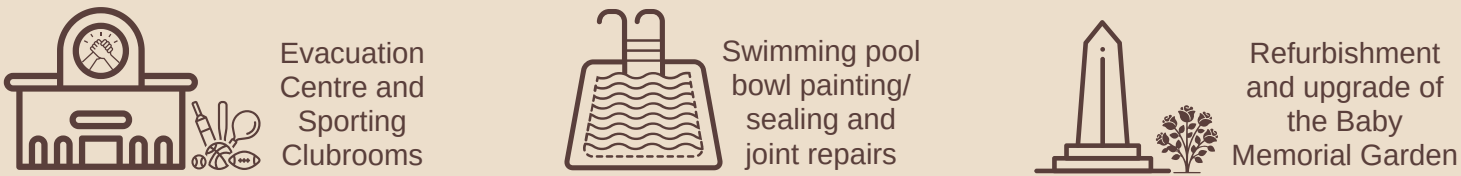
